## I. Early Education Career Incentive Program (EECIP) Update

- The new name is the Early Education Career and Incentive Program (EECIP). The new name clearly states the intention of the program to incentivize infant/toddler and preschool teachers to participate in ongoing professional development. We hope the new name will remind people of what the program stands for, Early Education Career and Incentive Program. Coordinator collaborated with CA Preschool Instructional Network (CPIN) to present Best Practices for Planning Curriculum for Young Children: Family Partnership and Culture training on Saturday, November 4<sup>th</sup> for state funded child care teachers.
- Coordinator collaborated with Santa Cruz County Mental Health, Trauma Informed Services program to present the *Trauma Informed Services* Leadership meeting on Wednesday, December 6<sup>th</sup> for state funded early care education administrators.

### II. Childhood Advisory Council – Central Coast Conference

Coordinator and subcommittee members hosted the Central Coast
Conference, on Saturday, October 7<sup>th</sup> in Aptos. The conference theme was
*Mindful Leaders: Transforming the Lives of Children*. The conference included
viewing of Raising America and keynote, two workshop session, mid-morning
snack and exhibits. The conference was attended by over 250 early educators.

#### III. Childhood Advisory Council – Master Plan Committee

 Master Plan consultant Shebreh Kalantari-Johnson and subcommittee members will began the process of developing the countywide five year Master Plan for early care and education. Once completed and approved the Plan will be submitted to the state June 30, 2018.

## IV. AB 300 (Caballero) Individualized Child Care Subsidy Pilot Plan

 Coordinator, Executive Committee and Subsidized Programs Consortium members are participating in state and regional meetings and conference calls with Governor's office and Bay Area Local Planning Council Coordinators, to begin the process of developing our county's Individualized Child Care Subsidy Pilot Plan. This will allow our county to develop new policies that will make it possible for more money to stay in our county.
