Are planning reopening in the beginning in March will phase in reopening. Enrollment has not declined. The gap is wider and has as many children returning so recruitment will be a big focus. Offering food services to families – days a week, two meals and seeing the numbers pick up. Will try to continue to offer food services. Getting ready for state audit and food program audit. LOSD: have two classrooms open AM and PM and two distance learning classes 3 days a week for families not interested in returning to preschool. Hold Harmless contracts, self-evaluations and curriculum. Had possible exposure information and protocols.
