There are 7 consultants who are moving to CDSS case loads will increase from 7 to 100 programs. Cassandra lewis is staying at CDSS. ● Encompass all distance learning and will reopen early head start and 10 month programs. COVID protocols review, provider meals care packages to families. Getting ready for the state review. ● Go Kids - Voucher got Tax 1099 forms out to the providers. Management Bulletins, CCL PINS Discussion, Legislative Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assembly Bill 82 Implementation and Paying Providers with Variable Schedule Enrollments Based on Certified Need which appropriates \$402 million for COVID-19 response, and (2) interim guidance on continuing to pay voucher-based providers with variable schedule enrollments based on the family's certified need for services. • \$244 million for one-time flat-rate stipends • - Reimbursement to providers for additional non-operational days for closures related to COVID-19, for certain contracts (as specified below) • - \$76 million to extend Emergency Childcare through June 30, 2022. • - \$80 million to enroll additional children in Emergency Childcare through June 30, 2022 <p>IEEEP look at the grant and layout the priorities and map out the training for the year.</p>	All
