	except for infant care, due to lack of teachers. They have hired a recruiter and increased their pay rate.	
	 L.Orosco (PVUSD) shared that they hired a MHS teacher. They are currently short staffed with employees 	
	on medical leave. Working hard to keep centers open	
	with the lack of staff. They are also working to connect with TK and K teachers, in communication regarding	
	needs, behaviors, obligations, etc.D. Brody (First 5) shared that they had a successful
