



## Child Care Planning Council Staff Report, by Diane Oyler

- I. **AB212 Program Development / Subsidized Consortium**
  - AB212 Advisory/SPC members identified training topics for the year that will meet the current needs of their staff. Trainings will focus on social emotional development, Desired Results Developmental Profile updates, CA Teaching Pyramid for Infant & Toddlers, and CPIN Preschool Learning Foundations Volume 3.
  - In addition, the coordinator will collaborate with Child and Family Development Program: Head Start to host quarterly professional learning community (PLC) opportunities. PLC's will support ongoing implementation of the CA Teaching Pyramid philosophy through peer learning and support.
  
- II. **Race To The Top and First 5 Signature Program**
  - Coordinator continues to attend the local RTT planning meetings to learn about new program developments and to offer helpful recommendations. Additionally, the coordinator attended the RTT family child care subcommittee to offer program development support.
  
- III. **Oaxacan Action Group Committee**
  - Coordinator attended the monthly *Watsonville Community Collaboration Committee, (WCCC), Oaxacan Action Group* meetings to assist with the completion of the family video.
  
- IV. **CA Teaching Pyramid Make N Take**
  - In collaboration with Child and Family Development Programs/Head Start the coordinator assisted in hosting the *CA Teaching Pyramid Make N Take* on Friday, September 6th. Maria Rodriguez, CFDP: Head Start facilitated an overview of the Teaching Pyramid levels. Teachers shared visual materials that support children's social emotional development used in their classrooms.
  
- V. **UCSC Child Care Campus-Community Planning Team**
  - Coordinator was appointed to the UCSC Child Care Campus-Community Planning Team. The planning team will produce needs assessments and pilot programming for a Family Resource Center in UCSC's Family Student Housing complex, Child and Family Learning Center and a feasibility study and business plan for a UCSC Faculty-Staff Child Care Center. Recommendations will inform the UCSC Child and Family Learning Network Steering Committee and ultimately be presented to the Campus Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for review and implementation, if possible.
